Incoming 9th - Students should read two books total, one nonfiction and one fiction.

All students should read one of the following nonfiction books:

- *Animal, Vegetable, Miracle: A Year of Food Life* by Barbara Kingsolver
- *The Omnivore's Dilemma* (Young Edition) by Michael Pollan
- *Chew on This: Everything You Don't Want to Know about Fast Food* by Eric Schlosser
- *Fast Food Nation: The Dark Side of the All-American Meal* by Eric Schlosser (for advanced readers)

All students should read one of the following fiction books:

- *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings* by Maya Angelou (memoir, contains mature content)
- *Mosquitoland* by David Arnold
- *Anya's Ghost* (graphic novel) by Vera Brosgal
- *Ready Player One* by Ernest Cline
- *The Call of the Wild* by Jack London
- *Monster* by Walter Dean Myers
- *Eleanor and Park* by Rainbow Rowell
- *Homestretch* or *Hurricane Song*, both by Paul Volponi

Incoming 10th - Students should read two books total.

All students should read ***Of Mice and Men*** by John Steinbeck.

All students should also choose **one** of the following nonfiction books to read:

- *The Boys in the Boat: Nine Americans and Their Epic Quest for Gold at the 1936 Berlin Olympics* by Daniel James Brown (There are two versions of this book--the original and one adapted for young adults. Both are excellent! Pick whichever is better for you.)
- *Malcolm X: A Graphic Biography* by Andrew Helfer
- *The Legacy of Luna* by Julia Hill
- *Mountains beyond Mountains* by Tracy Kidder (for advanced readers)
- *MARCH* by John Lewis, Andrew Aydin, and Nate Powell (This is a graphic novel trilogy about the Civil Rights Movement. Read any or all of the three books.)
- *The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks* by Rebecca Skloot
- *My Beloved World* by Sonia Sotomayor
- *I am Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and Was Shot by the Taliban* by Malala Yousafzai (There are two versions of this book: the original, and one adapted for younger readers. Both are excellent, so you pick which one you would prefer to read.)
- *The Bluebird Effect: Uncommon Bonds with Common Birds* by Julie Zickefoose

For all classes: bag, pencils, pens, lined paper, highlighter, colored pencils, and a water bottle. NOTE: A weekly planner for each student will be supplied by the school.

History, grade 9 and 10:

A three-ring holed pocket folder for handouts; a packet of post-it notes; and a double pocket homework folder.

English, grade 9 and 10:

Either a notebook or 3-ringed binder with lined paper; a folder with pockets for handouts; and a black and white composition notebook that will stay in the classroom.

Math, grade 9 and 10:

Either a notebook or a 3-ringed binder for notes; A folder or binder for handouts (you will get at least one a day that you will need to keep track of); 3-hole-punched graph paper; erasers

Environmental Science, grade 9:

One three-ring binder with 4 dividers (this binder could be shared with another class). Also 1 pocket folder, and graph paper.

Biology, grade 10:

One three ring binder with at least 1 or 2-inch rings, used only for Biology, with 5 dividers, 1 pocket folder, graph paper.

Spanish, grade 9 and 10:

One black and white composition notebook
One pocket folder
